Thank you for supporting our mobile phone policy. The use of phones in school has shown a great deal of improvement over the past few weeks. Please can we make parents aware that we have had some issues with students sending each other threatening or abusive messages through Social Media. A number of our students are on various group chats and they often use these chats to ‘banter’ with each other. This ‘banter’ often over steps the line, and a great deal of anxiety and upset can be caused. They can also use these group chats to ‘pick’ on each other and send abusive messages. In some cases this can become a serious police matter which we would all like to avoid! We would be very grateful if you could spend some time talking to your child about their appropriate use of social media. We are also having these conversations in school with the students; the more we talk about these situations the less likely it is that they continue to be a problem.

Online Safety - Training and Information.

This week as part of our staff training we had a session on keeping our students and ourselves safe in the modern online world. We have enclosed a number of leaflets provided by South West Grid for Learning. We thought these might be helpful to you when supporting your youngster when they are online. We were also given the name of a very useful website that we wanted to share with you.

www.common sense media.org

On this website you can enter the name of games and films that your child is playing or watching. It will give you a detailed common sense review of the nature of the content and how appropriate it is for your youngster. It takes the common sense approach that the children will be playing the games but It also gives guidance from youngsters and parents about what you need to be aware of and also lists issues raised when playing the game. We have arranged further sessions with our trainer working directly with the students to help them to stay as safe, online as they can be. We will provide further details nearer the time. In the meantime visit common sense media you will be glad you did.

School closure procedure in the event of bad weather.

Now that winter is beginning to set in I thought it would be good to remind you about the schools procedures for School Closure in the event of bad weather. Hopefully we will not see a repeat of last years repeat closures. Closing the school in the event of bad weather is always the **last resort** and this decision will always be made having completed a full risk assessment and been approved by a Senior Manager.

Procedure: The school will contact the Local Authority and inform them of a full or partial closure. The school will then appear on the closure lists of the Cornwall Council website and also local media outlets such as Pirate FM and Heart FM.

Informing Parents and Transport Companies: A member of the Senior Leadership Team will contact parents directly as soon as is practically possible after the decision to close has been made. At this time, an **urgent contact number** will be given to parents in order to make contact with the school should they need too during the closure.

The school will also inform taxi companies at the same time. Parents do not need to contact the company again. A senior Leader from the school will be in touch through the day to discuss arrangements for the following day.

The school will **never** inform parents about a school closure by asking your child to pass on the message. This is true in every circumstance and will **never** change.
